SMUD Michael W. Rate restructuring. to be evaluated by the SMUD board later this week. Re-aligning the service charge (stepped) Residents will not see a increase in their bill. Small Commercial customers will see a change in their fixed charged (switching to time of use). Hearing held tomorrow @ SMUD. No increase in revenue, changes may benefit large energy users and slightly effect low energy users. Purpose is to "align" SMUD as an organization to possibly compete with new Energy players such as Google et. al.

Steve Belzer introduces River access/ Levee issues. Pocket area, Ben Garcia Park. Speaker, Dan Gorfane (resident of pocket area). Bike trail effort. Former Mayor spoke in favor of the river trail on levee opening up. Attitudes may be changing. Friends of the Sacramento Greenway. "Now or Never" to open up to Discovery Park to the town of Freeport" Stan working for the state lands when things started to take shape. Bottom line is to inform LPCA and its members and look into building a coalition of community support. Long term vision is to have a loop around the county. Connecting with the Laguna and American bikeways. Audience member brought up concerns about existing property owners having concerns about privacy, safety and option to secure trail at night. The greenway concept will address both sides of the river.

Craig Powell president of the LPVC eye on Sacramento 6 weeks from now has to agree for parcel maps redistricting commission (15 members). Software program that allows any citizen to submit a maps for redistricting. They received 37 maps, narrowed down to 4 maps. Julius Cherry.
